Thanksgiving Food Project adjusts to pandemic protocol

For years, we've headed downstairs after worship on the Sunday before Thanksgiving to pack bags with Thanksgiving meal items that would be picked up on Tuesday. along with turkeys or chickens and other items, by our Food Center guests.

But with the pandemic, we can't do that this year. Instead, the Thanks- cards signed — one for each family. giving Food Project will be handled outside, as is our Friday Emergency Food Distribution. This will take place 10 a.m. to noon Friday, Nov. 20,

What's needed from the congregation? Donations of money to supplement the food Outreach gets from the Food Bank of CNY. Write "Thanksgiving Food Project 2020" on the memo line of your check or go to the church website and use a credit card. \$1,725 has been given so far.

UUMC welcomes new tenant: an organization aiding city students

UUMC has welcomed a new tenant: Academy of Excellence. It's an organization of two dozen educators working to meet city school students' needs, including providing technological hardware and building complementary curriculums to what the city school district is using.

The academy is occupying the lower level of the education wing for a rental fee of about \$19,000 yearly.

Stone to honor life and ministry of Peter Swords



We continue to move through preparations for our holiday food distributions and have created a great schedule that allows our community to access holiday foods in the same COVID safe manner we've been using on Friday mornings.

Our holiday food distributions will happen on Friday, Nov. 20, for Thanksgiving, and Friday, Dec. 18, for Christmas.

Currently we plan on hosting an additional food distribution on Wednesday, Dec. 30, to ensure it's not too long between guests' ability to access foods.

Although both the Thanksgiving and Christmas 2020 food distribution will look very different and the congregation's physical involvement is very limited, we hope that you all can support this expensive endeavor financially and with a Thanksgiving card that can be added to one of the 300 Thanksgiving boxes that will go out to our community.

- Total individuals served with Friday's Emergency Food Distribution: 4,973 (1,129 more than in September)
- Total number of families served who have children: 807
- 266 babies received diapers; this equals 13,300 diapers distributed in 2 hours
- Total guests who visited UUMC for Sunday breakfast: 257
- We received a large donation of Mickey/Minnie Mouse facemasks from MedDonation. These will be distributed until the supply is exhausted.
- First-year students from Upstate Medical University provided free blood pressure and diabetes screening for all of our interested guests and volunteers. About 25 participated.
- Myself, our volunteers and guests are interviewed regularly by SU students and different media groups in and around Syracuse. As our Food Center is a true demonstration of a successful interfaith collaboration between several food pantries, that we've experienced phenomenal growth in COVID and that we are successfully meeting the needs of a very large population of a wide variety of folk, we are a compelling story for media groups.

Advent Book Study This year's Advent weekly book study will be "Light of the World: A Beginner's Guide to Advent" by Amy-Jill Levine. Two sections of the study will be offered on Zoom: 1 to 2 p.m. Fridays, starting Nov. 27, and 6 to 7 p.m. Sundays starting Nov. 29, the first Sunday in Advent. 


As weather changes, worship to move Sunday 10:30 a.m. worship will move downstairs to the Pettengill Center in the near future to save money on heating.
